What are some of our cultural biases as Americans? How do these biases affect us? Can you identify one cultural bias that has affected you?
- 4. Please read Matthew 14:1-12. Herod comes to a conclusion about Jesus nobody else seemed to come to. Why? Can you identify any ways your past has created biases and unhealthy ways of looking at reality? How did these biases develop? How have they affected you?
- 5. Why is identifying our biases and getting free of them important? (John 8:31-32) Did any of the personal biases listed in the sermon resonate with you?
- 6. Discuss the three steps in escaping the tyranny of bias.
 - a. Admit I'm not unbiased. (Proverbs 28:26, 12:15, Eph. 4:17-19)
 - b. View everything through the perspective of the gospel. (2 Cor. 10:5)
 - c. When Jesus and I disagree, Jesus wins. (Luke 6:46)
