Getting Started

Going Deeper

- 3. In Matthew 24:36-25:46, Jesus responds to a question posed by the disciples. What's their question (24:3)? What's Jesus' response (see v. 36)? What features do these two parables (24:45-51; 25:1-13) have in common (see 24:48; 25:5)? How do these parables build on Jesus' statement in v. 36?
- 4. What does (and doesn't) it mean for believers to "watch" for Christ's return (25:13)? What are the dangers of misunderstanding Jesus' command to be vigilant?
- 5. Why are the wise women unwilling to share their oil with the foolish women (25:8-9)? What point about discipleship is Jesus making here?

Application

- 6. Jeff talked about the differences between an owner mindset and a manager mindset. What are the differences between these mindsets? Where do you need to change your mindset from that of an owner to a manager?
- 7. How can we rely *too* much on other people for our own growth as disciples? Where do you fall prey to this? What can you do to cultivate a deeper longing for Christ, and his return?
